Ordinance No. 52

An Ordinance Prohibiting an Open Container of Intoxicating Liquors or Beer or Non-Intoxicating Malt Liquors in Public Places in the City of Badger.

The City Council of the City of Badger, Minnesota, does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Open containers of intoxicating liquor, beer, or no-intoxicating malt liquor as defined by Minnesota Statutes, shall be regulated as follows:

No person shall have any open containers of intoxicating liquor, beer, or non-intoxicating malt liquor, as the same are defined by Minnesota Statutes, on any public highway, sidewalk, or any other public place in the City of Badger, Minnesota.

- **Section 2.** Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine by not more than Five Hundred and no/100 (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both.
- **Section 3.** All ordinances and part of ordinance inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- **Section 4.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and publication.
